# RULES & REGULATIONS

## GENERAL

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1. Brome Fair is organized by the Brome County Agricultural Society (the Society).
2. Brome County Agricultural Society membership of \$10 is due each year at the annual general meeting.
3. The Society shall not be responsible in any way for any animals/items lost or stolen on the fairgrounds. Nor shall it be responsible for any damage caused by an accident on the fairgrounds.
4. The Society reserves the right to change or amend any rules or regulations at any time, if deemed necessary.
5. Any member of the Society found guilty of loaning or otherwise giving use of a Society badge to another person, shall forfeit all premiums obtained by him during the year.
6. Smoking is strictly prohibited in all buildings on the fairgrounds.
7. No unauthorized motor vehicles are permitted to circulate on the fairgrounds during fair (ex: golf carts, cars, RTVs, tractors, etc.).
8. Unauthorized animals (dogs, cats, horse, etc.) are not permitted on the fairgrounds. EXCEPTION: Mira dogs; either working, in training or in foster families being socialized.
9. No Refunds are given on the purchase of admission to the fair.

## COMPETING

10. Persons intending to compete at Brome Fair must submit their complete entry forms with required documents/payments to the Brome County Agricultural Society (the Society) administration by **August 10<sup>th</sup>, 8 p.m.**
  - a. The post mark will not be considered.
  - b. Postdated cheques are not accepted.
  - c. Any incomplete entry can be refused.
  - d. If accepted, entries submitted after this deadline may be subject to a \$10 admin. fee.
11. Entries may only be submitted in through the following methods:
  - a. **Online:** WWW.ASSISTEXPO.COM/BROMEFAIR
  - b. **By mail:** With cheque payable to **BROME FAIR.**
  - c. **In person:** Payment can be made by debit, Visa, MasterCard, cheque, or cash.
  - d. **By email:** To **competitions@bromefair.com** accompanied by e-transfer to same email address.
    - \*Please list all names you are paying for in the e- transfer message/details
    - \*Password to use: Fun2023
12. All exhibitors must pay a Brome County Agricultural Society **membership fee of \$10** for the following year to exhibit. This entitles the holder to exhibit in all sectors of the fair.
13. **All animal exhibitors** (cattle, sheep, goats, horses) must have **valid liability insurance coverage** (minimum \$2,000,000) that includes their participation in Brome Fair competitions with their animal (s). A proof of this coverage, **in their name**, must be submitted with entry forms.
14. A Parental Consent form must be submitted for all minors competing in Horse classes.
15. A proof of age (copy of Medicare card) may be required for exhibitors participating in classes with age restrictions.
16. The Society may refuse any entries at its own discretion.
17. No article or animal shall be entered for more than one premium in the same year, except for horse performance classes, special prizes or as provided for in herd and group classes.
18. No competitor shall be entitled to more than one premium per class unless otherwise stated.

19. Every exhibitor of the Society will be liable to take the following oath if required by any member of the Society: "I do solemnly swear that all animals and/or articles exhibited by me are either my own or made or acquired by me according to the rules of this Society, so help me God".
20. Any member exhibiting an article for premium contrary to the rules of the Society will forfeit all prizes awarded him that year.
21. Additional 4-day passes will be given as follows:
  - a. Cattle: one (1) per three (3) head
  - b. Horses: one (1) per three (3) head
  - c. Sheep: one (1) per flock of six (6)
  - d. Goats: one (1) per herd of six (6)

A max of 3 additional 4-day passes may be given per exhibitor.

22. Monday Departure Times:
  - a. Horses, Beef, Dairy: 3 p.m.
  - b. Goats, Sheep: 4 p.m.

Any exhibitor loading animals before, will forfeit any prize money, entry fees and will not be allowed to return for the following two (2) Fairs.

23. All animals and articles entered for competition shall be ticketed and numbered and no person shall in any way interfere with the judges in the execution of their duties.
24. All prize ribbons which have been awarded by the judges must be displayed during the fair. Any infraction of this rule will ensure forfeiture of any premium awarded.
25. Any exhibitor lodging a protest must make it in writing, and it must be delivered to the president or the administration within three hours of the cause of protest. This must be accompanied by a deposit of \$30 in cash. If such protest is sustained, the deposit will be returned; if not, it will be forfeited to the Society.
26. The Society will not be liable for any bills or accounts for any prizes won that are not presented or sent to the administration within two months from the close of the year, 31st October, in which said accounts become due or said prizes won.
27. In the event of the Society having not enough funds to pay the prizes in full, the Directors reserve the right to deduct the necessary percentage.
28. All trophies must remain on grounds and returned to the office Monday night of Brome Fair.
29. All prize cheques must be cashed by October 31st of the current year.
30. All prize cheques will be mailed out after fair.

## DEFINITIONS

31. **Exhibit:**  
A unit of livestock qualifying for any entry into a class as specified in the classifications. All registered animals, whether owned by one person or by more than one person, individually or jointly, are considered to be the production of one farm or breeding unit on which they are maintained.
32. **Exhibitor:**  
Any breeder or firm which presents animals or articles for official placing by a judge at the time specified for judging.
33. **Breeding Unit:**  
In each classification where the same or common interests are involved in more than one breeding operation, such operations are considered as one **Breeding unit**. In all cases where there is any doubt that more than one breeding unit exists, the interpretation shall be that only one breeding unit exists. The responsibility of proof of separation of breeding units shall rest with the exhibitors.
34. **Purebred:**  
An animal of the breed as determined by the by-laws of an association authorized to register animals of that breed.

## JUDGES

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1. Judges shall be appointed by the officers and directors of the Society.
2. No person shall be allowed to act as judge who is in any way connected with the exhibit to be examined.
3. Judges are expected, in the execution of their duties, to be careful to act with the most rigid impartiality and to respect scheduled times and keep classes running accordingly.
4. Judges shall award premiums to the best manufactured article of its kind.
5. Judges shall, in awarding premiums on bulls, cows and heifers, have reference to the quality of such animals for improving stock and/or for dairy purposes.
6. Should there be one exhibit in a class or section; judges can use their own discretion as to awarding a premium. In all cases where they do not think the exhibit worthy, they can withhold the premium. Judges shall in no case award a prize unless they consider the exhibit worthy of such a premium.
7. Ownership of an exhibit shall not be in evidence during judging.
8. Any person not authorized to do so; conversing with the judge while on duty or otherwise interfering will forfeit any right he may have for a prize. It shall be the duty of the judge to report to the administration, on handing in the books, any infringement of the rule.
9. Upon discovery of any fraud, deception, dishonest practice, or misrepresentation regarding any exhibit, which may have influenced or been intended to influence the decision of the judge, the executive committee has the power to withhold payment of the prize awarded.
10. Any person who shall attempt to interfere with the judge in the performance of his duties, or shall afterwards, on the premises of the Society, use any abusive language to any judge in consequence of an award made by him, shall forfeit his right to any premium to which he might otherwise be entitled. Said person will also be excluded from exhibiting for one year thereafter. Judges are particularly requested to report any such breach of this rule.

## CAMPING: CATTLE, SHEEP, GOAT EXHIBITORS

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1. Price per Camp Site: \$50.00
2. A set number of camp sites (water, electricity) are available in the Gate A parking lot. **These will be numbered and assigned to exhibitors by Brome Fair.**
3. One camp site per exhibitor. Extra camp sites will be made available if possible. Any additional camp sites needed may be offered in alternate areas of the fairgrounds.
4. All requests for camp sites must be made by the exhibitor on the appropriate form with their entries and must include payment and the length of the house trailer (front to bumper).
5. Camp sites will be allotted to exhibitors on a first come first served basis from when their complete entries are submitted.
  - a. Special requests for location can be noted but are in no way guaranteed.
  - b. Committees will be responsible for assignment of camp sites.
6. Animal Trailers with sleeping quarters:  
Limited space is available in the Gate A parking lot. These must be reserved as all other camp sites. **ALL OTHER ANIMAL TRAILERS MUST BE PARKED IN THE RESERVED PARKING ACROSS FROM THE FAIRGROUNDS.**
7. Camping tents are not permitted.
8. House Trailers may only arrive on site during set hours:
  - a. Sunday before Fair: 12 pm – 7 pm
  - b. Monday before Fair: 5 pm – 8 pm
  - c. Thursday before Fair

9. House Trailers may only park in the camp site assigned to them. All other house trailers may be moved or towed at the expense of the owner.
10. Campfires are not permitted.
11. Awnings may be used but only if they fit in the designated area assigned.
12. Exhibitors will be given a Camp Site Pass for their numbered lot. These must be displayed in a visible area on the house trailer and will be verified by Brome Fair personnel throughout Fair.
13. Exhibitors will be expected to keep their space clean.
14. All house trailers must have the sanitary implements. Absolutely no grey or black water dumping on site.
15. All house trailers must have a functional fire extinguisher, fire alarm and carbon monoxide detector. House trailers will be verified by Brome Fair personnel throughout Fair.
16. All house trailers must be insured by the exhibitor.
17. Brome Fair reserves the right to remove any house trailers not in accordance these terms, without reimbursement.
18. All Campers must leave by Wednesday after Fair.

## CAMPING: HORSE EXHIBITORS

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1. Price per Camp Site: \$50.00
2. A set number of camp sites (water, electricity) are available in the Gate D Horse parking lot. **These will be numbered and assigned to exhibitors by Brome Fair.**
3. One camp site per exhibitor. Extra camp sites will be made available if possible. Any additional camp sites needed may be offered in alternate areas of the fairgrounds.
4. All requests for camp sites must be made by the exhibitor on the appropriate form with their entries and must include payment and the length of the house trailer (front to bumper).
5. Camp sites will be allotted to exhibitors on a first come first served basis from when their complete entries are submitted.
  - a. Special requests for location can be noted but are in no way guaranteed.
  - b. Committees will be responsible for assignment of camp sites.
6. Camp site assignments will be posted on site several days before fair.
7. House Trailers may only park in the camp site assigned to them. All other house trailers may be moved or towed at the expense of the owner.
8. Campfires are not permitted.
9. Camping tents are not permitted.
10. Awnings may be used but only if they fit in the designated area assigned.
11. Exhibitors will be given a Camp Site Pass for their numbered lot. These must be displayed in a visible area on the house trailer and will be verified by Brome Fair personnel throughout Fair.
12. Exhibitors will be expected to keep their space clean.
13. All house trailers must have the sanitary implements. Absolutely no grey or black water dumping on site.
14. All house trailers must have a functional fire extinguisher, fire alarm and carbon monoxide detector. House trailers will be verified by Brome Fair personnel throughout Fair.
15. All house trailers must be insured by the exhibitor.
16. Brome Fair reserves the right to remove any house trailers not in accordance these terms, without reimbursement.
17. All Campers must leave by Wednesday after Fair.

# VISITOR CODE OF CONDUCT

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To ensure the best possible experience for all our guests, we ask that you respect all applicable laws, our rules and guidelines as listed below (posted on the fairgrounds).

Your access to Brome Fair is conditional on your acceptance of these terms. We reserve the right to remove you from the premises if you are found to be in violation of any of them.

## GENERAL TERMS

1. Brome Fair is not responsible in any way for animals/items lost or stolen on the fairgrounds. Nor shall it be responsible for any damage caused by an accident on the fairgrounds.
2. No unauthorized pets/animals are permitted on the fairgrounds
3. Smoking is strictly prohibited in all buildings on the fairgrounds
4. Tickets & passes are non-exchangeable, non-refundable, revocable, and void if altered, lost, stolen or fraudulent.
5. Security screenings are in place at all entrances and within the fairgrounds. All guests and their belongings may be subject to such screening. Guests declining to be searched will not be permitted into the fairgrounds.
6. We reserve the right to refuse entry to the fairgrounds of any bag, parcel, or other items. We also reserve the right to deal with any unattended object in such way as we consider appropriate. Prohibited items should be kept at home, stored in your vehicle, or voluntarily surrendered at the entrance. Items will not be returned.
7. Any form of verbal or physical abuse to fellow Fair guests, volunteers, and employees will not be tolerated and will be grounds for immediate removal from Fair with no refund.
8. Laws prohibiting consumption of alcoholic beverages by minors, illegal drugs, and disorderly conduct of any kind will be strictly enforced. Guests arriving intoxicated will not be admitted into Fair.
9. Access to attractions or venues at Fair may be subject to additional terms and conditions. We have the exclusive right to determine whether you have satisfied any condition necessary to access an attraction or venue.
10. Amusement rides are available. All participants are expected to act in a responsible manner at all times and obey all oral/written guidelines.
11. The following activities are strictly prohibited:
  - a) Acts of demonstration, solicitation, distribution, or private sale of materials unless pre-authorized by Brome Fair personnel.
  - b) The distribution of printed or recorded materials of any kind.
  - c) Photography, videotaping or recording of any kind for commercial purposes.
  - d) Engaging in any unsafe act that may impede the operation of Fair or any associated venue.
  - e) Operating golf carts, ATV's and 4 wheelers on the fairgrounds without prior authorization from Brome Fair.
12. We may photograph, film, videotape, record or otherwise reproduce the image and/or voice of any person attending Brome Fair. These may be used for journalistic, advertising, marketing, promotional, archival and/or security activities without payment or compensation made to any person. You consent to this by entering the fair.
13. We reserve the right to deny admission or to require a person already admitted to leave Fair, without refund, liability or compensation if we consider that the circumstances so require.

14. We reserve the right to, without prior notice and without refund, liability or compensation, change the operating hours of Fair or any attraction, close Fair or any part of it temporarily, restrict the number of persons having access to Fair, and/or suspend or cancel any attraction or entertainment program if we consider that the circumstances so require.
15. This Code of Conduct is subject to change without notice. Changes may be made to, for example, reflect changes in our legal or regulatory obligations. Accordingly, we encourage each of our guests to refer back to it on a regular basis prior to attending Fair.

## **ADDITIONAL TERMS**

We endeavor to make your time at Fair as safe and enjoyable as possible.

Please be aware, however, that there are risks inherent to your visit, including being exposed to or infected with COVID-19. An inherent risk of exposure to COVID-19 exists in any public place where people are present.

By visiting the Fair, you voluntarily assume all risks and dangers connected to, associated with or incidental to your presence at Fair. We are not responsible under any circumstances for any loss, injury (including personal injury or death), illness, damage or liability that may arise out of or is in any way connected to your presence at Fair regardless of whether such loss, injury, illness, damages or liability arises from negligence, libel, defamation, loss of privacy, COVID-19, testing or screening for COVID-19 or otherwise.

## **PROHIBITED ITEMS**

The following items may not be brought into Fair:

- Alcohol, drugs & drug paraphernalia
- Weapons & replica weapons of any kind (knives, firearms, tasers, etc.)
- Explosives
- Corrosive chemicals
- Flammable substances
- Bicycles/scooters/segways/skateboards
- Hand tools/electric tools
- Drones/Radio Controlled devices
- Mace/pepper spray/bear spray
- Paint
- Pets/other animals except animals with a Service Dog Identification Card
- Banners/signs/voice amplification devices
- Air horns/artificial noisemakers
- Materials of an extremist/offensive /discriminatory nature
- Pad locks/chains/cables/zip ties/handcuffs
- Any item deemed a danger/threat to public order or safety

# ANIMAL WELFARE POLICY

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## PHILOSOPHY

The Brome Country Agricultural Society (BCAS) believes that each animal participating in its activities must, at all times, receive proper care and management in the best interest of their welfare.

Animal welfare is considered satisfactory if the following five criteria are met:

1. Absence of hunger, thirst and malnutrition.
2. Freedom from fear and distress.
3. Absence of physical and thermal stress.
4. Absence of pain, injury and disease.
5. Opportunity for the animal to express the normal behaviours of its species.

It is the policy of the fair that all animals are free of prohibited substances.

BCAS highly recommends that all animals be vaccinated as per veterinary recommendations.

## HEALTH VERIFICATIONS

BCAS reserves the right to require health inspections, proof of vaccination and/or that diagnostic tests be made at anytime prior to or during fair.

- The health condition of animals, as determined by the fair veterinarian, shall be final and cannot be protested.
- Animals will be rejected if evidence of infectious, contagious, or parasitic disease is apparent or if health certification and/or identification documentation are not accepted.
- Exhibitors who refuse to allow their animals to be examined shall be disqualified. No refunds will be made.

## ANIMAL CARE AND MANAGEMENT

The care, custody and control of animals is the sole responsibility of the owner and/or exhibitor.

BCAS authorized personnel will only take charge of animals brought onto the fairgrounds in the event of an emergency or other urgent circumstances.

BCAS, in collaboration with the official fair veterinarian, reserves the right to require that animals deemed unsuitable for public display and/or in distress, be taken to a location designated by the fair and/or removed from the fairgrounds.

Guidelines:

1. Restraining Animals:
  - a. Animals should be tied or penned in a manner that will not hurt the animal or restrict its breathing in any way.
  - b. Animals should be tied so all its feet are firmly on the ground, and they have enough room to stand comfortably and lie down.
  - c. Animals should be tied so they cannot injure animals tied near them.
  - d. Animals unaccustomed to each other should not be penned together.
2. Handling:

Any type of rough handling which could harm the animal is prohibited. The use of whips, canes and show sticks should be restricted to showing only and then be used only to guide, not punish the animals. The animals respond quicker and better to quiet, gentle handling, than loud, rough handling.
3. Bedding:

All animals should have bedding that is dry and clean. Pens should be cleaned regularly to keep the



animals clean and comfortable. If non-traditional bedding, such as carpet is used, it should be regularly cleaned (at least twice daily) to keep the pen free from manure.

4. Feeding and Water:

Animals should be well fed and have access to clean water regularly. Animals not allowed reasonable access to feed and water will be disqualified from the event.

5. Transportation:

Animals should be transported in a way that is both safe and considerate of the animal's wellbeing.

6. Blankets and Sweat Collars:

Any type of material such as blankets or sweat collars should be large enough to permit normal body functions such as breathing, eating, drinking or lying down.

7. Health:

It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to provide proper health care for their animals through routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals. The improper or illegal use of drugs or antibiotics is prohibited. If medication is indicated, be sure to follow the label.

### **EMERGENCY PROCEDURES**

In the event of an emergency BCAS authorized personnel, in collaboration with the show veterinarian, will be responsible for resolving problems in areas reserved for animals or during competitions.

#### **Escaped Animal:**

- If an animal escapes from its designated containment area, the owner/exhibitor and BCAS authorized personnel will make every effort to confine the animal as quickly as possible.
- If necessary, fair security will secure the perimeter and handle crowd control.
- If the animal escapes from the fairgrounds, fair security and the police department should be advised.

#### **Injured or Dead Animal:**

If an animal on the fairgrounds is injured or dies, the designated veterinarian will be notified immediately to coordinate a quick, expeditious and appropriate response.

If emergency action is required prior to the arrival of the veterinarian, authorized BCAS personnel will ensure that the animal is moved to a designated location for evaluation as quickly as possible.

- A stall/area in the livestock and horse areas will be set aside for the treatment and/or evaluation of injured or sick animals.
- A wagon/trailer will be available to move an animal to the designated area if necessary.
- If an animal dies on the fairgrounds, it must be loaded onto a wagon/trailer and covered with a tarp for removal from the public area to a designated area. BCAS personnel and the veterinarian will assist the exhibitor and coordinate the disposal of the animal.
- The fair will maintain an incident report on all animal injuries and/or deaths.

### **POLICY FOR HANDLING ANIMAL RIGHTS ISSUES**

#### **For all fair personnel:**

All inquiries from the public, media, or representatives of animal advocacy groups regarding the care or management of animals should be directed to the appointed spokesperson.

In the event of a demonstration, reference should be made to the safety policies of the fairgrounds.

Any activity or demonstration that is disruptive for fair visitors, exhibitors or livestock must be handled by the police. The fairgrounds are considered private property; therefore, anyone engaging in activities that are not in the best interest of the fair may be evicted.

### REGISTRATION

1. Entries may be refused or reduced if stable accommodation is full.
2. Maximum number of animals per exhibitor, per breed, is ten (10), calves included.
3. There is no restriction on multiple exhibits in any classes (Exception: group classes).
4. All animals must be owned by and registered as purebred in the name of the exhibitor (exceptions: group classes)
5. All animals shown in group classes must have been shown in regular classes.
6. All exhibits must be registered in the name of the exhibitor in accordance with the by-laws of their respective association. The certificate of registration must state that the animal is purebred or at least 75% of purebred inheritance. All exhibits must be legibly tattooed (if applicable).

### ARRIVAL / DEPARTURE

7. **Arrival:** Thursday and Friday (no later than 10 a.m.)
8. **Departure:** Monday as of 3 p.m.
9. All animal trailers must park across the road from the GATE A parking lot in the designated area. No trailers are permitted to remain in the GATE A parking lot.
10. Each exhibitor will receive 2 Gate A parking passes. Exhibitors with 6 or more head will receive 1 additional parking pass. Only vehicles with these parking passes are permitted in the Gate A parking lot.

### STABLING

11. One (1) bag of shavings or straw bale per head present, up to a maximum of ten (10), will be supplied to dairy exhibitors on a daily basis.
12. No wood chips or dirt allowed for bedding. Only straw or shavings may be used. Bedding must remain within designated floor markers. No Large Bales.
13. No blocking chutes or fans will be allowed in the aisles behind cattle during the fair.
14. No cattle washing anywhere except at wash rack.

### VERIFICATION

15. Exhibitors must be available for animal verification Friday afternoon.
16. Verification of exhibits is the responsibility of the fair committee. The committee must exclude ineligible animals and those not positively identified before judging.

17. Animals suffering from contagious diseases may be disqualified. If deemed necessary, veterinary consultation may be requested.
18. Registration certificates must accompany animals.
19. ATQ numbers (site and animal identification) must be available for verification or will be automatically disqualified from the show.
20. **Only three (3) animals will be eligible for substitution.** Substitute animals will be confirmed during verification. The total number of animals exhibited at fair cannot exceed the quantity entered. To appear in the show catalogue substitute animals must be declared in writing by email (competitions@bromefair.com) no later than 5 pm Wednesday before fair. Any substitutes made afterwards will not be recorded in the show catalogues.

## COMPETITION

21. **Judging:** Saturday, 10:00 am
22. Three (3) exhibitors and twenty-four (24) head per breed is required for judging.
23. If less than four animals are registered for an individual class, these animals will be moved to the next class.
24. **Breeding:** In cases where doubt exists in the mind of the judge or official as to the breeding capability of an animal, the exhibitor may be required to furnish evidence to the satisfaction of the official concerned.
25. **Tampering:** Unnatural practices in fitting will not be tolerated and all cattle entered for competition shall be presented in the judging ring in their natural conformation and natural physical condition.
26. **Code of ethics for dairy exhibitors:**  
The following practices or procedures are considered unacceptable and defined as being unethical in the show ring of registered dairy cattle. In registering, all breeders and exhibitors are engaged in the respect and observance of the Code of Ethics.
  - a) Misrepresenting the age of the animal for the class in which it is shown.
  - b) Balancing the udder by any means other than by leaving naturally produced milk in any or all quarters.
  - c) Treating or massaging any parts of the animal's body, particularly the udder, internally or externally with an irritant, counterirritant, or other substances, to temporarily improve conformation or produce unnatural animation.
  - d) Minimizing the effects of cramp or lameness by feeding or injecting drugs.
  - e) Surgery of any kind performed to change the natural contour of appearance of the animal's body, hide or hair. Not included is the removal of warts, teats, and horns, clipping and dressing the hair and trimming of hooves.
  - f) Insertion of foreign material under the skin.
  - g) Criticizing or interfering with the judge, show management or other exhibitors while in the show ring, or other conduct detrimental to the breed or show.
27. **Production records:** Not required.
28. All exhibitors must wear appropriate show attire.
29. Championships (Ribbon only): All animals must have been shown in regular classes.

## PARADE

30. All Champions and Reserve Champions (Junior, Senior, Grand) must participate in the Parade or forfeit prize money. All other exhibitors are welcome to participate on a voluntary basis.

## TRAVEL COMPENSATION

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The following Travel Compensation will be paid to exhibitors in addition to their prize money. Distances will be calculated from the address of the exhibitor to the fairgrounds.

### PROVINCIAL SHOW

1. While Brome Fair remains open to residents from any province, Quebec residents exhibiting in these sections will also be competing in the Provincial Show.

### REGISTRATION

18. Entries may be refused or reduced if stable accommodation is full.
19. Maximum number of animals per exhibitor, per breed, is fourteen (14), calves included.
20. There is no restriction on multiple exhibits in any classes (exception: group classes).
21. All animals must be owned by and registered as purebred in the name of the exhibitor (exceptions: group classes).
22. All animals shown in group classes must have been shown in regular classes.
23. All animals being shown in single classes must be registered as purebred by the closing date of entries, except calves under three months of age, which must be properly tattooed in two year and mature cow/calf classes. All animals must be legibly tattooed. Calves over three months of age must be registered unless the by-laws of an association states that an animal cannot be registered until older.

### ARRIVAL / DEPARTURE

24. **Arrival:** Thursday and Friday (no later than 10 a.m.)
25. **Departure:** Monday as of 3 p.m., out of province exhibitors may depart Sunday after 7 p.m.
26. All animal trailers must park across the road from the GATE A parking lot in the designated area. No trailers are permitted to remain in the GATE A parking lot.
27. Each exhibitor will receive 2 Gate A parking passes. Only vehicles with these parking passes are permitted in the Gate A parking lot.

### STABLING

28. One (1) bag of shavings or straw bale per head present, up to a maximum of ten (10), will be supplied to beef exhibitors on a daily basis.
29. No wood chips or dirt allowed for bedding. Only straw or shavings may be used. Bedding must remain within designated floor markers. No Large Bales.
30. No blocking chutes or fans will be allowed in the aisles behind cattle during the fair.
31. No cattle washing anywhere except at wash rack.

### VERIFICATION

32. Exhibitors must be available for animal verification Friday, 10 am.



33. Verification of exhibits is the responsibility of the fair committee. The committee must exclude ineligible animals and those not positively identified before judging.
34. Animals suffering from contagious diseases may be disqualified. If deemed necessary, veterinary consultation may be requested.
35. Registration certificates must accompany animals.
36. ATQ numbers (site and animal identification) must be available for verification or will be automatically disqualified from the show.
37. **Only three (3) animals will be eligible for substitution.** Substitute animals will be confirmed during verification. The total number of animals exhibited at fair cannot exceed the quantity entered. All animals listed on the entry form will be on the show program, while substitutes will only be listed on the judge's sheet.

## COMPETITION

38. **Judging:** Saturday, 10:00 am
39. The following requirements must be met:
  - a. A minimum of one hundred (100) animals competing.
  - b. A minimum of three (3) animals competing per class
  - c. A minimum of three (3) exhibitors competing per breed
  - d. A minimum of and eighteen (18) animals competing per breed
40. **Split classes:** For all species, classes may be split at the discretion of the fair committee. Each split class is considered a separate class, by definition.

43. **Restraint of bulls:** Any bull exceeding twelve months of age must be restrained using a ring or humbug. This rule applies at any and all times this animal is being handled on the grounds. Failure to comply with this rule will result in instructions from the Board of Directors to remove the animal from the show and possibly from the premises.
44. All exhibitors must wear appropriate show attire.
45. Championships (Ribbon only): All animals must have been shown in regular classes.

## PARADE

1. While Brome Fair remains open to residents from any province, Quebec residents exhibiting in these sections will also be competing in the Provincial Show.
2. The Provincial Show includes the following purebred halter sections only:  
Sections 101-105, 140-147, 150, 154, 160, 161, 165

### REGISTRATION

3. Entries may be refused or reduced if stable accommodation is full.
4. All registered animals must be owned by and registered as purebred in the name of the exhibitor (exceptions: group classes)
5. A copy of the registration certificate for all registered horses must accompany entry forms, or in the case of spring and summer foals, a breeding certificate must be available.
6. All registered animals shown in halter group classes must have been shown in regular classes.
7. Exhibitor ages are to be as of January 1 of the current year for classes with age restrictions. A proof of age (photocopy of Medicare Card) must be submitted with entries.

23. All stalls are to be kept clean and tidy at all times. The horse committees reserve the right to verify.
